# NAIDOC CELEBRATIONS

The National Aboriginal and Islander Day of Celebration happened at Fairview Heights SS on Thursday 22nd August. On this day our students participated in a range of cultural activities, including creating wearable art and an informative and engaging session with our guest presenter, Don Nikkelson. Children also played outdoor indigenous games and listened to traditional and contemporary indigenous music. Other classes viewed educational programs using our classroom digital whiteboards and discussed personal views on indigenous culture in Australia. Yet another class was seen weaving baskets using traditional materials and methods and others were learning to hiphop by following an episode of 'Move it Mob Style'.

Staff and students alike learned something new while celebrating NAIDOC. The buzz that was created by the day's activities echoed around the school all day long! Our guest presenter showed us indigenous instruments and demonstrated how they were played and why they were used in indigenous dance and music. He encouraged us all to watch and then try some indigenous words and dances - even some students and teachers joined in and danced up on stage, with lots of cheering from the audience. Many thanks to Don for sharing his knowledge, culture and good humour with us on this day.

NAIDOC was well supported by our classroom teachers and also by our amazing school Library team who continue to showcase indigenous art, story, dance and song in the Library. The stories and photos that were heard and seen from around our beautiful school were ones of enjoyment, learning and, most impressively, of deep respect for our indigenous culture. Our indigenous students also received a gift on the day - thank you to Carbal Health for donating the picture books. A HUGE THANKS TO TEACHERS Mandy Morgan and Michelle Greer for the work they put into the program for NAIDOC Celebration Day.

Now that NAIDOC is over, our Deadly Ones program has restarted with our third round of sessions for the year. This means we have eleven students from seven of our indigenous Fairview Heights families currently involved. The Deadly Ones program operates in our school and is designed to promote respect and understanding of our student's personal indigenous backgrounds and it also creates and deepens relationships between our school and our indigenous families. We tasted some bush tucker today - and it was deadly!


